

## ILS TRAINING SESSION, DORTMUND

**ADD HOME partner ILS held its first training session in Dortmund focusing on activities in the City of Bielefeld.**

The training event “Mobility meets housing – a most promising encounter” attracted about 40 people from housing companies, mobility providers and local authorities. Doris Bäumer from ILS introduced into the topic and gave a detailed overview about goals, results and current activities of ADD HOME in Germany. Moreover, guest speakers, i. a. from the housing companies BGW Bielefeld and Wohn + Stadtbau Münster and the mobility provider moBiel referred about their own experiences with mobility services for their clients and mobility management options in housing. Lively discussions with the participants of the training created a very constructive atmosphere.



## AMI TRAINING SESSION, GENOA

**Two special trainings for public decision makers in the West District of Genoa.**

The two trainings were organised in the Council Committee and in the Council of the West District of Genoa in the presence of the President, the Councilmen, the Councillors and citizens. ADD HOME and its objectives and topics were introduced first. Then, the events focused on two issues: the Italian norms concerning sustainable mobility for the construction of new housing areas and the concrete problems connected to mobility of inhabitants in high density residential areas. Both points of the discussion were related to the main problem of Pegli in the West District: too high volumes of private car traffic. AMI's ADD HOME actions in Pegli, car sharing, carpooling and the info mobility web page, were deemed as very good solutions and they were politically approved by a deliberation.

## UNIVERSITY OF MARIBOR TRAINING SESSION, MARIBOR

**The Faculty of Civil Engineering conducted the training seminar entitled “Mobility Management for Housing Areas”**

The seminar was aimed at the undergraduate and graduate students in engineering programs, i. e. transport, construction and architecture. Its main purpose was to raise students' awareness and knowledge concerning the potential and effects that mobility management can have for planning, construction and managing of residential areas. The practical part took very personal form by discussing the problems and benefits experienced primarily by post-graduate students in their daily life. The ADD HOME good practice examples were used to demonstrate the advantages of links and coordination between mobility management and the planning of residential areas in practice. Details were also presented about potential obstacles and opportunities offered by the current legislation in Slovenia.
